Overloading can cause damage to or failure of the jack stands and bodily harm.


Position load on center of saddle only. Always use stands in pairs on hard level surface capable of sustaining the load. Use of stands on anything other than a hard level surface can result in stand instability and possible loss of load.



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# Operation

- 1. Refer to your vehicle owner's manual for proper jacking procedures. Lift only on areas of the vehicle specified by the vehicle manufacturer.
- Position stands under vehicle at points specified by the vehicle manufacturer as proper load support points.
- 3. To adjust stands:
  - 1. Screw low/high stand fitted with thrust bearing. (10802 & 10803)
  - 2. Reinforced low stand with controlled pin holes, turn, and oil jack stand post.
  - 3. Reinforce high stand with holes without controlled pin.
- 4. Carefully lower load onto stands.



# **Maintenance & Inspection**

- 1. Visual Inspection shall be made before each use of the stands, checking for cracks, cracked welds and missing and / or damaged parts. Any stand that appears to be damaged in any way should be removed from service immediately.
- Because of the potential hazards associated with the misuse of equipment of this type, no modifications should be made of the product without consent from manufacturer.
